

His researchers created a computer program that measures the shape of someone's face, which means it's easier than ever before to tell a woman whether her appearance is acceptable or not.

We're sorry if there's a hint of sarcasm coming through here, but come on. How are your ratios, De Silva?


"The Phi ratio of 1.618 has long been thought to hold the secret for beauty, but now with the computer mapping we can calculate how it applies to real women," he said.

According to his calculations, Heard's face is the most aesthetically pleasing.



"[Her]eyes, eyebrows, nose, lips, chin, jaw and facial shape were measured and 12 key marker points were analysed and found to be 91.85 per cent of the Greek ratio of Phi, which is 1.618," *Us Magazine* quotes the study.
